Dr. Diane Ford, Associate Professor of Art, joined the faculty of Stephen F. Austin State University in September of 1967 after receiving her doctorate from North Texas University. She was deeply committed to her students in Art Education and Art, and although active in the production of art she felt she was first and foremost a teacher. Her students, friends, colleagues, and family established this scholarship in her memory to be awarded in May each year to a sophomore or junior art education major who shows exceptional promise and/or potential.

1. The scholarship award will consist of the interest earned from the permanent fund.
2. The recipient must be pursuing a degree in Art Education at Stephen F. Austin State University and maintain a minimum GPA 2.50.
3. The scholarship is to awarded to a sophomore or junior who shows promise and/or potential of achievement in Art Education to inspire or encourage the awardee. If not such promise or potential is evident during a particular school year, the award will not be made in that year and the value of the award will be added to the permanent fund.

This scholarship shall be awarded on the basis of both artistic promise and need of students, both those who are able to qualify for financial aid and those who are unable to qualify.

1. Recipient must be majoring in art, art education or art history at Stephen F. Austin State University.
2. Recipient must be a full-time student at Stephen F. Austin State University.
3. Recipient must be classified as a sophomore, junior or senior.
4. Recipient must maintain a 2.5 GPA or better.
5. Art majors must submit a portfolio of ten works, either the works themselves or high quality photographic, digital or slide reproductions, to the Department or Art Office one week after the scholarship application deadline for subsequent review by the Department of Art Scholarship Committee, who will select the recipient of the scholarship. The applicant can retrieve the portfolio after the Scholarship Committee completes the portfolio review and selects the recipient of the scholarship. In lieu of a portfolio, art education and art history majors must solicit and submit a brief letter from one professor in their major that evaluates the promise shown in their major.
6. Deadline for applying for this scholarship is February 1st of each year.

Established in 1985 with a donation of 5,000 by Lucille Fouts Raborn in the honor of her children. The following qualifications are established to select a recipient for the annual scholarships to be awarded by the Lucille Fouts Raborn Scholarship.

1. Recipient must be enrolled and in good standing at Stephen F. Austin State University, and a resident of the state of Texas.
2. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of financial need, character, and dedication in the field of art.
3. Recipients must be a sophomore or above.
4. One-half of the scholarship will be awarded in the Fall. Grades will be reviewed at the end of the Fall semester. If they are satisfactory, the remaining half will be awarded for the Spring semester.
5. Students wishing to apply for the scholarship should contact the Alumni Association, PO Box 6096, SFA, Nacogdoches, TX 75962-6096.
6. The deadline for applying is February 1st of each year.
7. An art faculty committee will select a recipient from the above criteria from applications submitted to the SFASU Alumni Association.

Established in 1986 by friends and family of Professor William Arscott in honor of his mother's memory, Elsie Arscott.

1. Recipient must be enrolled and in good standing at Stephen F. Austin State University.
2. The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of need, character, and dedication to the field of art.
3. Recipient must be an art major.
4. The scholarship will consist of interest from permanent fund.
5. Student must be taking a minimum of 12 semester hours.
6. One-half of the scholarship will be awarded in the Fall. Grades and academic performance will be reviewed at the end of the Fall semester. If these are satisfactory, the remaining half will be awarded for the Spring semester. A 2.50 GPA in art and a 2.00 point all college GPA must be maintained.
7. Students wishing to apply for the scholarship should contact the Alumni Association, PO Box 6096, SFA, Nacogdoches, TX 75962-6096.
8. The deadline for applying is February 1st of each year.
9. The Art Scholarship Committee will select a recipient from the above criteria from applications submitted to the SFASU Alumni Association.

Emily Hargraves Painting Scholarship

Endowed by the friends of Emily R. Hargraves, the scholarship is to be awarded in May of each year to a sophomore or junior student who shows promise in painting or drawing.

1. The scholarship will consist of interest earned from the permanent fund.
2. The recipient must be pursuing a degree at Stephen F. Austin State University and maintain at least a 2.00 GPA.
3. The scholarship is to be awarded to a sophomore or junior student who shows promise in painting and/or drawing. If no such promise is evident during a particular school year, the award will not be made that year.
4. The recipient will be agreed upon by all of the art faculty who teach painting and drawing.
5. The committee's decision shall be made by May 1st of each year.
6. Applications for this scholarship are available in the Alumni Association. The deadline for applying to the Alumni Association is February 1st of each year.

Established in 1983 by the family and friends of Debbie Simpson and Terry Miller.

The following qualifications are established to select a recipient for the annual scholarship to be awarded by the Debbie Simpson/Terry Miller Scholarship Fund.

1. Recipient must be enrolled and in good standing at Stephen F. Austin State University.
2. Recipients must show interest in art.
3. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of character and dedication in the field of art.
4. Each scholarship will consist of interest earned from the permanent Simpson/Miller Fund
5. One-half of the scholarship will be awarded in the Fall. Grades and academic performance will be reviewed at the end of the Fall semester. If these are satisfactory, the remaining half will be awarded for the Spring semester. A 2.50 GPA must be maintained.

Melba Cranford Memorial Art Scholarship 1985

Endowed by Marilyn Cranford, Box 96, Sacul, Texas 75788, sister of Melba Cranford, a 1940 graduate of Stephen F. Austin State University.

1. Recipient must be pursuing a degree in art at Stephen F. Austin State University.
2. Scholarship will consist of interest earned from the permanent fund. One-half of the scholarship will be awarded in the Fall, the other half in the Spring.
3. Recipient must maintain at least a 2.00 GPA and show promise in the field of art. Financial need is a high priority.
4. The art department scholarship committee at Stephen F. Austin State University will choose the recipient.
5. Applications for this scholarship are available in the Alumni Association.
6. Deadline for applying for this scholarship is February 1st of each year.

Endowed by friends and relatives of Barbara Brown Schoenewolf, the scholarship is to be awarded in May of each year, on an alternating yearly basis beginning with printmaking, to a sophomore or junior student who shows promise in printmaking or strings.

1. The scholarship will consist of interest earned from the permanent fund.
2. The recipient of the Printmaking Award must be pursuing a degree at Stephen F. Austin State University and maintain at least a 3.00 GPA in previous art classes.
3. The recipient of the Strings Award must be pursuing a degree at Stephen F. Austin State University and maintain at least a 3.00 GPA in all classes.
4. The scholarship is to be awarded to a sophomore or junior student who shows promise of achievement in printmaking or strings. If no such promise is evident during a particular school year, the award will not be made that year.
5. The recipient will be agreed upon by all of the printmaking faculty or by all of the string faculty, as may be the case.
6. The committee's decision shall be made by May 1st of each year.

Brian Philip Joseph Labarbera Memorial Scholarship

Endowed by the friends and relatives of Brian Philip Joseph LaBarbera , an art student studying sculpture:

1. Recipient must be enrolled and pursuing a degree in art at Stephen F. Austin State University.
2. The scholarship will consist of interest earned from the permanent fund.
3. The recipient must not be related to John Allen Pearce, and can not be participating in SFA's athletic program.
4. Recipient must have and maintain a minimum overall GPA of 2.00.
5. Recipient must have returned a completed Stephen F. Austin State University Alumni Foundation Scholarship Application Form to the SFASU Alumni Association by February 1st prior to the Fall semester of the same year.
6. Scholarship is renewable to teh current recipient.
7. Selection of scholarship recipient will be done by an art faculty committee.
8. If not applicant meets the above described criteria, the Alumni Foundation Scholarship Committee may use its discretion in selecting a recipient.

Endowed by Roland and Helen Weeks, family, and freinds of Stephen Weeks, an art major at Stephen F. Austin State University.

1. Recipient must be pursuing a degree in art at Stephen F. Austin State University and be classified as either a junior, senior, or graduate student.
2. Scholarships will consist of interest earned from the permanent fund. One-half of the scholarship will be awarded in the Fall, one-half in the Spring.
3. Recipients must maintain at least a 2.00 GPA and show promise in the field of art. Financial need is a priority.
4. The art department scholarship committee at SFASU will select the recipient.
5. Applications for this scholarship are available in the Alumni Association, PO Box 6096, SFA, Nacogdoches, TX 75962-6096.
6. Deadline for applying for this scholarship is February 1st of each year.

7. A Fine Arts Scholarship Committee will choose the recipient from the above criteria.
8. Application for this scholarship must be turned in to the Alumni Association by February 1st.
9. The Art Scholarship Committee will select a recipient from the above criteria from applications submitted to the SFASU Alumni Association.
